- Post-stay breastfeeding support

"Being able to assist concerned moms beginning breastfeeding and for them to know resources are plentiful here—is huge! We have an entire team of professionals willing and ready to help moms reach their breastfeeding goals."

Upon adopting the Baby-Friendly® practices in 2019, 70% of all babies born at Parrish Medical Center were exclusively breastfeeding for the entire birth hospitalization by the end of 2020.

According to Baby-Friendly USA, immediate and uninterrupted skin-to-skin contact and breastfeeding within the first hour after birth are essential to providing the nutrients and energy needed for physical and neurological growth and development of infants.

Parrish Medical Center will be joining 595 Baby-Friendly® facilities in the United States, representing 28.07% of annual births.

The Baby-Friendly® initiative also includes support for mothers who prefer or are medically required to formula feed.
